The 3G network decommissioning will start in December 2023 with Vodafone, followed by Telstra in June 2024, and Optus in September 2024.

Vehicles with 3G GPS and fleet management tracking devices will need to migrate to 4G devices to prevent loss of signal and data transfer to ensure ongoing compliance, safety, and visibility of organisational assets.

Where to Start

Proper planning is essential. Start by assessing your current telematics system and identify the devices that rely on the 3G network. Speak to your telematics provider to understand the upgrade options available and any hardware or software changes required. It's also a good opportunity to review your fleet management needs and consider any additional features or improvements that may be beneficial.

Anticipate High Demand and Longer Waiting Time

Industry experts predict there are many fleet management units still operating on 3G. With a small number of installers available in Queensland, Local Buy encourages Fleet Managers to review their current systems as a matter of urgency. Local Government elections are taking place early in 2024 and councils will move into caretaker mode in January. This means that no significant procurement activities (over \$200,000) can take place until after the election.
