Local Buy simplifies the procurement process by connecting councils to prequalified local Queensland suppliers, big and small.

All councils want to support their local businesses, but council procurement is costly, takes time, needs to manage fraud and corruption, risks, and must meet Queensland Audit Office standards.

Councils were asking for help with procurement, which is why the Local Government Association Queensland (LGAQ) created Local Buy in 2001. Access to Local Buy is a valuable component of LGAQ membership. The profits from Local Buy are returned each year to the LGAQ and invested to help keep council membership fees low.

Local Buy's pre-qualified Arrangements are unique and a first for local government in Australia as they open every 3 months to new suppliers, compared to every 2 to 3 years for other States or panels set up by individual councils.

Procurement Technology

Successfully implemented a state-wide, fully funded procurement system for Queensland local government. This system enables councils to engage suppliers through Local Buy Arrangements, internal prequalified lists, or public tenders, all via a unified platform.

State Government
Procurement Solution

The solution provides a single hub where suppliers can receive notifications and information about government tenders, and a supplier marketplace for buyers to search for suppliers based on the products and services they require, reducing the time and costs associated with securing government contracts.

Online and face-to-face pre-tender briefing

Introduced monthly pre-tender briefings for suppliers and buyers.

Welcome sessions

Over 500 suppliers attended face-to-face welcome sessions.

North Queensland procurement summit

Saw 39 attendees from 14 Councils attend the NQ Procurement Summit in March.

VendorPanel training

Over 50 users have been trained in June & July in VendorPanel from a blend of QLD & NT Councils, NFP's and State Government Departments.

New and refreshed arrangements

Launched 4 new Arrangements to market including 6 major refreshes.

Industry Development Fund

The Local Buy Industry Development Fund (IDF) was established in 2007, in partnership with Telstra, with the aim of benefiting local government in Queensland by providing financial assistance towards improving technology transformation and business processes through technology.

The IDF has evolved with a forward focus to fund macro-themed projects that benefit local government broadly or could be scaled to benefit broadly, whilst also continuing to support micro projects that satisfy the criteria and benefit individual councils. Local Buy and Telstra's primary aim through the IDF continues to support technology innovation that helps local government meet community needs.
